## WORKING AT HEIGHT

- Inspect fall protection equipment before use.
- Secure tools to prevent dropped objects.
- Ensure 100% tie off to approved anchor points when outside protected area.



## DRIVING

- Wear a seat belt.
- No speeding and reduce speed for road conditions.
- No phones unless hands free.
- Driver is fit, rested and fully alert.



## LINE OF FIRE

- Position yourself to avoid moving objects, vehicles, pressure releases and dropped objects.
- Establish and obey barriers and exclusion zones.
- Secure loose objects and report potential dropped objects.
